9. REPORTS FROM REPRESENTATIVES

- **9.1 Chamber of Trade:-** No report received.
- **9.2 Cromer in Bloom:-** Nothing to report at present.
- 9.3 Cromer Pier:- Jo Atherton reported that Chas & Dave will be performing this weekend. The Summer show sales are going well and the Christmas tickets are already on sale. The Pier will be holding four open days on Saturday 4th April, 1st August, 31st October and one just before Christmas. Jo would welcome ideas for the open days. Rebecca Wass's position will not be filled. Jo will wear two hats as General Manager and Promotions Manager. The official opening of the Pier will be in the near future and the shop will be open for the Summer season.
- 9.4 VEO:- Tony Shipp reported that the arrangements for the 2015 Carnival are going well. At present the committee do not know whether the Red Arrows will be visiting Cromer this year and Tony suggests that the public look at the Red Arrows website as it will be advertised there first. VEO have requested permission to close the Runton Road to hold a Soap Box Derby on Sunday 19th July in the afternoon. It will be a short course from the Cliftonville Hotel to Morrisons Petrol Station. Children's day arrangements are progressing well and there are four new young people on the committee.
- **9.5 RNLI:-** Richard Leeds reported that their Open Day will be held on 3rd May and there will be a display in Nat West Bank. Lifeboat Day will be held on 26th July and the launch of the lifeboat will be at 3 pm. Storm Force Day will be held on 20th September and between 50 and 100 youngsters will be invited for the day.

- **9.8 Twinning:-** Cllr. Nash reported that there will be a French walking group visiting this year and they would like to link up with Walkers are Welcome and Fit Together.

Olive Edis was a leading female photographer during WWI and a bid has been submitted for £90,000 to develop her collection. Olive Edis was employed as an official war photographer at the end of WWI and was also a Royal photographer. More information concerning Olive Edis will be circulated once to hand.

- **10.1 St. George's Day Concert:-** The Clerk reported that a St George's Day concert will be held in St Peter and St Paul's Church this year. There will be no ticket price but a retiring collection will be made. The Cromer and Sheringham Brass Band will be playing and the concert will begin at 7.30 pm.
