- **11.2 Cromer in Bloom:-** Cllr. Bond reported that the maintenance is continuing. The Bus Station planting is dependent on the Cromer Town Council grant being successful this year. Minutes attached.
- 11.3 Cromer Pier:- Jo Athurton reported that the cast for the Summer Show have arrived. There have been invitations sent to all members of the committee and Town Council for the opening night of the Summer Show. Sales are up 40% compared to this time last year. They are very short staffed at the moment. The restaurant is now open but the official launch will be at a later date. The Pier of the Year Award has had a positive effect and the Pier have used this in their promotional material which has had good coverage. North Norfolk District Council wish to celebrate the Award and a presentation of a certificate will be made to them at the opening night. The pier toilets have been entered for a Loo of the Year Award. It was AGREED that the Christmas team can collect on the pier again this year and the Clerk will liaise with Jo on dates.
- 11.4 Cromer VEO:- Tony Shipp reported that they had a slight set back printing the programmes as they had lost Mick Weddup suddenly a few weeks ago. This is now back on track. The Summer programme is now available with Cley Pigeon Shooting on Sunday 21st June, a float in the Lord Mayor's Procession on Saturday 4th July and the Soap Box Derby on the Runton Road. There will be a helpers meeting on Wednesday 15th July. The raft races have been

- moved to 26th July to fit in with the tides. They have a replacement for the Red Arrows with three displays from the Blades and the Yaks.

2. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 20TH APRIL 2015

The minutes of the meeting held on Monday 20th April 2015, having been circulated, were taken as read, **AGREED** and signed by the Vice-Chairman.

3. **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

Prejudicial declarations of interest were received from Cllr. Leeds in respect of the PA system.

4. CHRISTMAS ARRANGEMENTS

4.1 Christmas Market:-

New Street and Garden Street Market — Traders:- Chris Lynch reported that 25 stalls have now booked. He is aiming for 40 in total. All the arrangements are going well. It was AGREED that Cllr. Bond will liaise with Paul Stowe to design and erect an archway of lights at the entrance to High Street next to Budgens and Garden Street at Mary Jane's to encourage footfall to the street market. The Clerk confirmed that she has asked Jason Bell the Town Crier to attend and promote the event.

Parish Hall, Community Centre and Charity Stalls:- The Clerk reported that bookings have been received for all venues. All arrangements are going well. Community Carol Service:- The Clerk reported that the new Mayor is happy for his civic service to be combined with the community carol service on Sunday 6th December. The Clerk will update the committee with arrangements as they are made.

It was **AGREED** that the Clerk would prepare a form for the market stall holders to complete with a disclaimer for electrical goods, tax and NI etc. Cllr. Bond will ask Cromer in Bloom if they are prepared to decorate the entrance to the Parish Hall again this year.

Rev. Sharon Willimott will liaise with the Christmas Lighting Team to enquire whether they can provide two 6ft trees for outside the Parish Hall once again this year. She will also make enquiries as to what happened to the lights which were on last year's trees. The lights belong to Cllr. Bond.

4.2 Entertainment:-

Stage – Outside:- This matter will be placed on the next agenda for an update from Tony Shipp.

Church, Parish Hall and Community Centre:- Cllr. Conisbee reported that she has contacted all the performers from last year but only one has confirmed to date. She will chase accordingly. It was AGREED that Cllr. Conisbee will look into the possibility of holding a children's choir competition in the Parish Hall where the Children's events will be concentrated. Adult choirs and performers will be booked for the Parish Hall and the Community Centre. The Clerk reported that she and Cllr. Frosdick had met with Alistair from Cromer Museum to discuss the possibility of having entertainment in front of the Museum. Alistair is very keen for Cromer Museum to be involved in town events and would welcome entertainment or stalls in the area in front of the Museum with the proviso that the entrance to the Museum is not blocked. The Clerk will remind Cllr. Yiasimi that he is liaising with North Norfolk District Council concerning the removal of the centre flower bed to enable this area to be paved in order that it can be used as a performance area for town events.

Santa's Grotto – Christmas Lighting Team:- Rev. Sharon Willimott reported that she is hoping to develop Santa's Grotto and will report to the next meeting on progress.

Face Painting:- The Clerk confirmed that she placed an article in the Cromer Times asking for volunteers but to date no interest has been received. It was AGREED that all present will make enquiries and report back to the next meeting. Cllr. Consibee passed some contact details to the Clerk for a face painter and photographer. It was AGREED that the Clerk would contact Coleen and ask if she is prepared to volunteer her services. If she is prepared to volunteer the Clerk will invite her to the next committee meeting.
